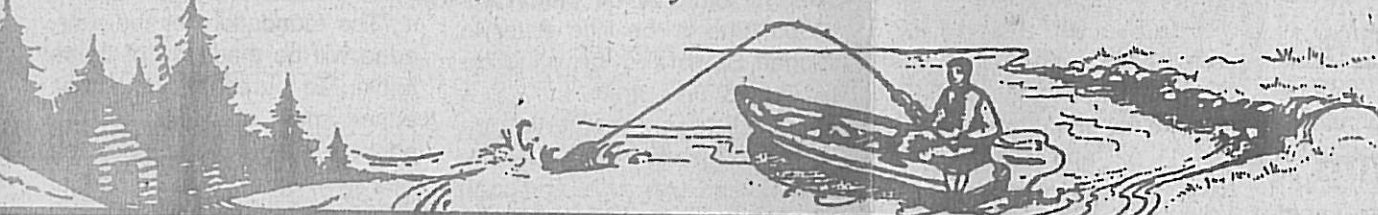

No Watering Restrictions

No irrigation watering restrictions are expected this year for the Beaver City Irrigation Water System. The City took this position acting on recommendations made by the Irrigation Advisory Committee.

Careful and efficient water use is still encouraged because overuse reduces the amount of water others have available for their livelihood.

The March 1, forecast for April through July 2005, is for 41, 000 acre-feet of water for the Beaver River and 27, 000 acre-feet for the Minersville Reservoir. These forecasts are undated monthly by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service. The City's position will not likely change with a forecast more than five times the 7, 000 acre-feet for 2002. This was the lowest water year in the fourteen years the system has operated.

Beaver City has made to major improvements to the irrigation system over the past winter. Two large areas of the city that were being serviced by the
