PAL Expands to All Grades

The Program for Advanced Learners, PAL, is now being implemented at all grade levels in Socorro Schools.

According to B.J. Moore, program director, teachers will implement an enrichment component into the regular classroom, rather than pulling students out of class for enrichment study. Teachers will be trained to meet the specific needs of the high achieving student.

Moore said that there are honors courses at the seventh and eighth grade level.

At the high school level, high achievers will be participating in a mock trial competition where they will learn first hand some of the procedures of the legal system as well as have an opportunity to sharpen communications, group speaking and legal reasoning skills. The mock trial is part of a statewide competition.
