

# UTEP first: study in London

David Duimich, a 19-year-old UTEP sophomore, flew to London last week for a semester of study under a new foreign study program.

Duimich is the first UTEP undergrad to qualify for study abroad under a program arranged by the University of Texas System and the American Institute of Foreign Study.

Duimich and his family have lived 11 years in Horizon. He attained the rank of Eagle scout before graduating from Socorro High. A sister, Gabrielle, 21, is a graduate of Texas Tech and served as a 1984 sun princess in the Sun Bowl festivities.

Duimich's fees for three months stu-

dy in London will be the same as if he were studying here. So will his teachers. The teachers he will have there are on loan from the UT System, according to the UTEP campus newspaper, the Prospector.

In addition to fees, Duimich is paying \$2,895 to cover room and board for the semester at the University of London. He also has to cover air fare to and from London, spending money while there and any side trips he takes on the continent.

"Definitely, there will be side trips to the continent," David said. In fact he plans to get a rail pass that will give him unlimited travel around Europe, a continent he's never visited.

And what about London? "There are over 70,000 pubs in London," Duimich said. He indicated he plans to see a fair share of them.
